Presentations are sensitive to and respectful of the values and beliefs of parents/carers and families in our catholic parish community and provide and excellent opportunity for family discussion about human sexuality and respectful relationships. The sessions will run as follows:

Session 1 Years 3 & 4 (6-7 pm)

- Families & People their similarities and differences, acknowledging change, and that happy and challenging times are a part of typical family life.
- Bodies acknowledging how alike we are whilst identifying different body parts
- Privacy & Safety recognising our ownership to protect our bodies.

Session 2 Years 5 & 6 (7.15pm-8.15pm)

- Puberty impact of hormones, common physical changes, emotional & social changes, new feelings, changes specific to male & female bodies.
- Reproduction, foetal development & birth
- Privacy & safety

STUDENT WELLBEING Friends

Two big no-nos if you want to make friends are:

to push in to a group and try to take over

to hang back and not show you are interested.

It's also really bad to be a gossip or tell tales about someone. However, "dobbing" someone in who is bullying or harming others is not telling tales. It is making sure that the rights and safety of others are respected.

You've got to find that middle line that shows you are interested but don't take over or spoil their game!

Don't give up trying to make friends if you're not very lucky at first. Just be yourself, smile and be friendly so that others will want to know you. Others may feel as shy as you do or you may have to find a different group to get friendly with. Keep trying.

Sometimes you may have very different friends like these children.

- 'My friend is a baby. I like to play with him as he always smiles when he sees me
- 'My friend is a horse. It is beautiful and has a lovely nature.'
- 'I like me. I like how I ride my bike. I like how I ride my skateboard.'
- 'Isaac lets me play football with him because he likes me too. Isaac is a very tall friend.'
- 'I have a friend who is a baby kangaroo. She likes me to feed her.'
- 'I have friends on a game site. We compete against each other".

HEAD INJURIES

Any child who has a knock / bump to the head will have their parents notified as a precaution. All children who are treated in sickbay or on the playground are issued with a First Aid slip; however, often these are not seen by Parent. All staff is trained in first aid each year to Level 2, which should be very reassuring for parents, but we will not make decisions or judgments regarding head injuries.


