Susan McLean – cyberbullying information evening for parents.

21 August at 7 pm at St Bede's college auditorium

I can highly recommend this information session to you and would encourage all parents to attend. I have heard Susan talk, and over the years I have certainly rang Susan for advice on how to best deal with cases of cyberbullying.

I will be attending and hope I will see as many St Joseph's parents there as possible.

Susan McLean is Australia's foremost expert in the area of Cybersafety and young people. She was the first Victorian Police Officer appointed to a position involving Cybersafety and young people. She took her first report of cyberbullying in 1994 and since then she has conducted extensive research and has completed advanced training in this area in both the USA and UK and is a sought after presenter and advisor to Schools, elite sporting bodies such as the AFL, GP's, and both State and Federal Governments.

I have included a letter from the Catholic Education Office about the future of Catholic education in light of Windsor College closing at the end of 2020.

Dear Parents.

We are here to stay: Catholic education boss says Despite media speculation on school closures, Catholic education is strong and here to stay, says Catholic Education Melbourne Acting Executive Director, Jim Miles. 'Ill-informed conjecture by some outlets regarding the viability of Catholic schools with enrolment decline is feeding uncertainty in some school communities', Mr Miles said. 'Hardworking Catholic school principals who are making a real difference to their communities and to shaping the lives of so many young Victorians are being chased by journalists out for a scoop that just isn't coming.' Mr Miles said that the Catholic sector was saddened by the Presentation Sisters decision to close Presentation College Windsor, but that this did not reflect the broader situation in Catholic schools across Melbourne.

'Instant analyses that only focus on one or two data points do not reflect a fully informed picture for Catholic schools', said Mr Miles. 'In a number of schools, including Mercy College, Coburg, and Nazareth College, Noble Park North, new leaders are breathing life into their school communities and turning around enrolments.' 'Instead of talking down school communities and undermining parents' confidence in their choice of Catholic education, single-sex education or a combination of both, commentators should pause to try and understand the individual circumstances of school communities.' 'What might be true in one school is unlikely to be true in another', Mr Miles said.

Mr Miles also said that Catholic Education Melbourne works with all schools to ensure they have a viable future. 'Catholic education has a number of processes in place – marketing training, access to demographic profiles and systemic frameworks – to address and arrest enrolment decline where necessary', said Mr Miles. 'We are committed to working with all school communities to deliver a quality Catholic education to their students.'

'We are also mindful of our commitments to both the Victorian and Australian governments to deliver educational and community value for the investment they make in Catholic schools.'

WELLBEING

'Positive Behaviour for Learning'

Our students are encouraged to practise positive behaviour towards each other to enhance their learning. As they demonstrate these positive behaviours, based on our own school expectations, they earn tokens as rewards. We also refer to our 'Classroom Positive Behaviour for Learning Flowchart' if these behaviours are not demonstrated. These minor and major negative behaviours have consequences. Over the coming weeks, we will revisit these behaviours and their consequences

MINOR BEHAVIOURS (the first seven)

- *Calling out or interrupting
 - *Not listening
 - *Answering back to the teacher
 - *Failure to follow instructions

- *Pushing people
- *Retaliation (physical)
- *Threats-verbally and physically
- *Not listening when someone says stop
- 1st instance redirect student/intervene
- 2nd instance redirect/another intervention. Reminder about the expectation
- 3rd instance intervention, record on behaviour tracker and move to Major Behaviour
