Dear Parents,

The Catholic Education Commission of Victoria (CECV), in conjunction with the Victorian Building Authority (VBA) is undertaking a state-wide audit of Catholic Schools to identify the potential use of external combustible cladding in CECV Schools.

The VBA is auditing specific types of 2 storey and higher buildings for external combustible cladding across Victoria, including high rise apartment buildings, hospitals, aged care facilities and schools.

The VBA considers schools to be lower risk than other building types, as they are not occupied overnight and are subject to regular evacuation drills.

The audit has identified the presence of combustible cladding at, St Joseph's Primary School.

The VBA has undertaken a risk assessment of this building and has advised that the building is able to be continued to be used for normal school operations.

The school is obtaining quotes to resolve the minor works that the VBA Advisory Reference Panels have identified.

The school in cooperation with the VBA and Bayside Council will undertake rectification works as soon as possible and will keep the school community up to date.

Thank you to Melanie Leydin, Mark Botterill, Matthew Griffith and Paul Davys for agreeing to be on our building cladding team. We are in the process of collecting quotes for the removal of the cladding and will keep you informed of our progress.

She took her first report of cyberbullying in 1994 and since then she has conducted extensive research and has completed advanced training in this area in both the USA and UK and is a sought after presenter and advisor to Schools, elite sporting bodies such as the AFL, GP's, and both State and Federal Governments.

FIRST COMMUNION



WELLBEING

'Positive Behaviour for Learning'

Our students are encouraged to practise positive behaviour towards each other to enhance their learning. As they demonstrate these positive behaviours, based on our own school expectations, they earn tokens as rewards. We also refer to our 'Classroom Positive Behaviour for Learning Flowchart' if these behaviours are not demonstrated. These <u>minor</u> and <u>major</u> negative behaviours have consequences. Over the coming weeks, we will revisit these behaviours and their consequences

MINOR BEHAVIOURS (the next eight)

- *eating on stairs or undesignated areas
- *incorrect use of school equipment
- *dominating particular spaces in playground and using the 'we're bigger than you' excuse
- *ripping plants out of the garden

- *being in out of bounds areas eg: Peace Garden/stealing flowers
- *sharing food
- *chromebook not fully charged every day
- *off task on chromebook
- 1st instance redirect student/intervene
- 2nd instance redirect/another intervention. Reminder about the expectation
- 3rd instance intervention, record on behaviour tracker and move to Major Behaviour
