#### **Nazareth Advisory Education Board Update**

- What is the board working on?
- There are 3 main priorities at the moment.
- **Covid19** management of the Covid-19 situation and the transition back to school for our children. Both schools have reported the return to school has gone well and the children were very excited to return. Both parents and teachers have done a tremendous job over this challenging period. We are staying close to the situation and have contingency plans in place.
- **Principal for St Joseph's** our other main priority is recruitment of a new Principal for St Joseph's. Carmel will be starting her new role at the start of term 4. The board is actively engaged in the recruitment process and is interested in accelerating the process. We want to take this opportunity to reiterate the St Joseph's school is not closing.
- **Collaboration** on an ongoing basis the board is exploring opportunities on how the two schools can be more united and collaborate more effectively. We have a strong community connection and this is stronger with a united front across the parish.


