Dear Parents,

Today the Foundation and Grade 1/2 students had an incursion, 'Write Away With Me'. An author worked in each grade for 1 ½ hours and the students started to write a story that will be published and sold in term 4 at St Joseph's own book launch. Beth will work with the grade 5 & 6 students on Monday 27 May and the grade 3 & 4 students on Thursday 30 May. The classroom teachers will continue to support the students to work on their books and complete their illustrations. All the manuscripts will then be sent to a publisher at the end of term 3, ready for the launch in Term 4. If you would like to see what a finished book will look like, one will be available in the office for you to have a look at.

On Wednesday 29 May we are having a guest speaker Father Peter O' Neill talk to our students in grades 3-6, from 2.30 – 3.30pm. I heard Father Peter talk at Easter Sunday mass and I was inspired by his message. Father Peter worked for 28 years in Taiwan and is from Geelong and has been back in Australia 18 months. He will speak to the students about looking at the things we eat and wear and to see where they come from and who has made them. He will tell us of the poor conditions and pay, that are given to the workers and how we need to protect them from this abuse by thinking about what we buy. Parents are most welcome to attend and I can highly recommend it.

Dine with Heart

Next Wednesday 29 May, as a school community, we are going to participate in 'Dine with Heart.' Throughout the month of May, we can help raise much-needed funds to support the Sacred Heart Mission's Meals Program by having our own Dine with Heart activity at school. The Sacred Heart Mission is situated in Grey St, St Kilda and is a charity that we can support in our own Bayside of Melbourne.

National Collection of Consistent Data

Under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, schools have an obligation to ensure that students with disability are able to access and participate in school on the same basis as their peers.

To ensure this, students with disability may receive adjustments or support, depending on their functional needs, to access and participate in education.

Parents, guardians and carers have an important role in their child's education. They work collaboratively with the school to ensure that the school understands their child's needs and that appropriate adjustments are made to enable access to education.

The NCCD is an annual count of students who are being provided with adjustments to address disability. All Australian schools and approved authorities for schools participate in the NCCD each year.

Student with Disabilities also included students with an anaphylaxis and / or Asthma plan. St Joseph's is preparing our NCCD data and it will be submitted on Friday 2 August.

Our Yr 6 Student Voice leaders, Pippi and Thomas, are currently collecting books ranging from Early Learning to Harry Potter level.

Please have a hunt through your bookshelves at home and bring those books to school. They will be much appreciated by those less fortunate than our own children. Please ensure they're in **good** condition.

BOOK DONATIONS

All books must be in very **good** condition. As they help kindergartens through to high schools, there is a wide range of books that they accept. As a guideline, they take the most basic ABC books through to Harry Potter level.

Each year they have to reject approximately 20% of donated books as they are in poor condition or inappropriate which uses up resources.

Kindergarten supplies

They take kindergarten level books, wooden educational toys, art and craft supplies, and other durable early childhood toys and games.

Last weekend marked the 180th anniversary of the first Mass celebrated in Melbourne. It was celebrated by a young Franciscan priest, Patrick Bonaventure Geoghegan, on a makeshift altar in a shack in Elizabeth Street. It was May19, 1839. A few weeks later the Government gave Geoghegan a grant of land on the corner of Elizabeth and Lonsdale streets. He laid the first stone of what was to become St Francis' Church on the feast of St Francis Assisi in 1841.

VICTORIAN PREMIERS' READING CHALLENGE



The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and St Joseph's is excited to be participating. The Vic PRC is a great opportunity for children to read as many books as they can throughout Term Two and Term Three.

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 6 September 2019.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

Your child has been given a username and password for the challenge. In order to keep track of the books that have been read, students and parents are to log the books using their username and password.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

HEAD LICE - ONCE A WEEK TAKE A PEEK



HEAD INJURIES

Any child who has a knock / bump to the head will have their parents notified as a precaution. All children who are treated in sickbay or on the playground are issued with a First Aid slip; however, often these are not seen by Parent. All staff is trained in first aid each year to Level 2, which should be very reassuring for parents, but we will not make decisions or judgments regarding head injuries.
