Dear Parents,

Ash Wednesday will be celebrated next Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> February. Lent is a reminder of the importance of sacrifice, prayer and looking after those in need. Lent helps us more deeply understand the Easter event that is at the centre of our Christian faith, and strengthens our commitment to living the life of love and mercy to which Christ calls us. We can use this time to consider how our actions are defining our relationship with God, with others and with our deepest self. Lent is a time for renewing those relationships based on compassion, truth and justice.

# Beginning School Mass, morning tea and a film - Sunday 23 Feb.

# St Joseph's Student Mobile Phone Policy

Commencing Term 1 2020 all Victorian Schools are required to implement documented processes for the management of mobile phones by students under their care. In accordance with the <u>Victorian Minister for Education's direction and Section 5.2.1(2)(b) of the Education and Training Reform Act 2006</u>, students who choose to bring mobile phones and other devices to school must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours.

Students should be discouraged from bringing personal mobile phones and other devices to school. However, it must be acknowledged that some students may bring a personal mobile phone to school in the following instances:

- Making their way to and from school
- Where they have been granted an exemption for
  - o Learning related adjustments
  - o Health conditions

# Gr 3/4 -All Systems Go

Inside a futuristic machine "The Venture", the Captain and his crew take the class on a tour of the human body. Travelling through the blood, the class explore and discover how magnificent the human body really is. They learn the functions of various body parts and the actions required to keep these systems working well.

## Gr 5 & 6- Decisions

Students explore the decision making process and improve decision making skills by looking at choices, consequences, responsibility, facts and influences.

- What is a drug and how drugs are classified
- Effects of drugs on the body
- Analysing health messages about drugs in the media
- Messages around non-use normative data dispelling myths
- Influences on decision making family, peers, media, culture, financial, legal
- Strategies and skills to be safe

# SHROVE TUESDAY



Tuesday is a day of celebration as well as penitence, because it's the last day before Lent. Lent is a time of abstinence, of giving things up. Shrove Tuesday is the last chance to indulge yourself, and to use up the foods that aren't allowed in Lent. Giving up foods: but not wasting them. In the olden days, there were many foods that observant Christians would not eat during Lent: foods such as meat and fish, fats, eggs, and milky foods. So that no food was wasted, families would have a feast on the shriving Tuesday, and eat up all the foods that wouldn't last the forty days of Lent without going off.

# **LENT**

Lent is a good time to disentangle ourselves from all the things that Get us tied up in knots. It is a time when we are called to simplify life and to focus more on others, rather than ourselves. It is the season to work on our inner freedom, as we prepare to celebrate again the death and resurrection of Jesus, the heart of our faith and the source of our freedom.

**Ash Wednesday**, a day of fasting, is the first day of Lent in Western Christianity. It occurs 45 days before **Easter** and commences on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> February and concludes Easter

Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> April. Mass and the distribution of ashes will be celebrated at 9.15am mass this Wednesday.
