AGM CHAIR REPORT

Thank you all for attending the first Annual General Meeting of the Nazareth Education Advisory Board. This Board was newly constituted in 2019 as a single Education Advisory Board to service both Stella Maris and St Joseph's schools under the Nazareth Parish.

The role of the Board for the first year of operations was to establish the Nazareth Education Advisory Boards Constitution and Guidelines for the purposes of servicing and assisting both schools within the Parish. The Board was appointed directly by Father Denton for 2019 and consisted of myself as Chair, Father Denton, Carmel and Yvan as school principals, Helena as teacher representative for Stella Maris and Geraldine Davys, Jennie Bolger and Adrian Hills as parent representatives. This Board had a tenure for 12 months and had a very specific role for this period.

The Board held 4 meetings during the year and refined the Constitution and Guidelines at each meeting and also determined the mechanisms by which the two 2 schools will work together to ensure common policies and practise. On occasions there was a need to establish school sub-committees to deal with specific school matters. This sub-committee option worked well and gave greater direct support to the school and principals to deal with specific school matters or projects. This sub-committee structure will continue as required and has now been written into guidelines and constitution.

Sometimes there is a misconception on the Role of the Education Advisory Board within the school. This has now been carefully reviewed and updated within the Guidelines and Constitution. The Education Advisory Boards key role is the following:

- Assisting in the formulation and review of school policy.
- Monitoring of the school's fees and levies.
- Planning for the future.
- If required, assisting the Parish Priest in the selection of a principal when such an appointment is being made.
- Developing strategies for the local promotion of Catholic education.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow Board members including the School Principals and Father Denton for all the work that has been done by the Board over the last 12 months (with a special mention to Carmel for preparing such lovely home cooked dinners for us at each meeting). The work of this inaugural Board has allowed these two schools to come together in a fantastic collaborative style. The driving force behind this move to a single Board was to ease the administrative burden for both school Principals and the Parish Priest. I believe we have achieved this objective well and I know we are handing over a well thought through Constitution and set of Guidelines for the new Board.

Moving on to the formalities now. The format of tonight will be the report from Parish Priest and the Reports from both Carmel and Yvan. We will then move to General Questions from the School Community. Following this we will then discuss and vote on the elections for the Board.
