Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The Foundation and Grade 1 students have participated in the Atrium this term, over a fortnightly rotation, every Friday. Mrs Liz Freeman (a teacher, trained in the Atrium) and Mrs Lisa Brick (a parishioner trained in the Atrium) have been taking these classes with one of our teacher aides to help.

For Term 2 only the Foundation class will participate in the program. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is part of our Religious Education Program and supports the teaching of RE through play, stories and songs. All parents are welcome to attend a session. Every Friday, half the class at 12-1pm and the other half of the class from 1-2pm.



The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Christian formation program for children based on the work of a scripture scholar and Montessori educator. The result of a long period of observation of children, its underlying principle is simple; to identify the specific needs and interests of the child and provide materials to allow them to develop at their own pace.

The Environment

Children gather in the *Atrium*, a room specially prepared for them, containing simple materials they use to help them hear and absorb essentials of the Christian message. After a theme has been presented based on scripture, the liturgy or practical life, the child is free to work with those materials. *This allows them to hear the Gospel through the use of sensorially-rich materials.*



- Tackers use enthusiastic professional instructors who relate well to young children
- Well maintained Optis and rescue
- Follow safe operating practices.
- Combination of on the water and off the water activities.
- Participants will receive a cadet membership and one social membership for one parent. This will allow the cadet's family to visit the club for meals and use the facilities at the club, as part of their course
- All Tackers Courses are 20 hours and are run over multiple days.

Tackers is a learn to sail programme for kids, developed by Australian Sailing to get more primary school aged kids sailing at local vacht clubs. 
