#### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



The beginning of the School Year Mass was held last Sunday at St. Joseph's Church. We had a wonderful celebration for our 90 years and enjoyed being together to celebrate as a community.

The Yr 3 students, and their parents, attended the Reconciliation Faith night last week and learnt many aspects pertaining to the sacrament. They are preparing with their teachers for their second sacrament.



#### SHROVE TUESDAY



Tuesday is a day of celebration as well as penitence, because it's the last day before Lent. Lent is a time of abstinence, of giving things up. Shrove Tuesday is the last chance to indulge yourself, and to use up the foods that aren't allowed in Lent. Giving up foods: but not wasting them. In the olden days, there were many foods that observant Christians would not eat during Lent: foods such as meat and fish, fats, eggs, and milky foods. So that no food was wasted, families would have a feast on the shriving Tuesday, and eat up all the foods that wouldn't last the forty days of Lent without going off.

Next Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> March all students will be making pancakes with their classroom teachers.

#### **LENT**

Lent is a good time to disentangle ourselves from all the things that het us tied up in knots. It is a time when we are called to simplify life and to focus more on others, rather than ourselves. It is the season to work on our inner freedom, as we prepare to celebrate again the death and resurrection of Jesus, the heart of our faith and the source of our freedom.

**Ash Wednesday**, a day of fasting, is the first day of Lent in Western Christianity. It occurs 45 days before **Easter** and commences on Tuesday 6th March and concludes Easter Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> April. Mass and the distribution of ashes will be celebrated at 9.15am mass.

#### Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships

Foundation students have been talking about 'overcoming obstacles' when things don't go their way. How could they handle tricky situations in a better way?

All staff is trained in first aid each year to Level 2, which should be very reassuring for parents, but we will not make decisions or judgments regarding head injuries.
